TKC Community Contributions Policy

Objective for Contributions

The objective of TKC Community Contributions is to support our Corporate purpose: to enhance our land, culture and the lives of our people.

In-kind contributions will be prioritized for education, social service and cultural projects that directly benefit TKC Shareholders. Contributions are preferably made to organizations and events that have impact beyond an individual Shareholder.

Contribution Priorities

Education

Efforts to support academic training opportunities for Shareholders and individuals of the Middle Kuskokwim Region are a top priority. Efforts will also be made to connect Shareholders living outside of the Middle Kuskokwim Region with local resources in their communities. In-kind contributions may include classroom assistance, special projects, and job and career readiness programs.

Health & Human Service Organizations

Charitable causes that benefit the overall wellbeing of Shareholders and/or TKC Villages are important to the Corporation. Examples include health fairs, sobriety or prevention events, and organizations working to improve health outcomes.

Culture & Arts

Programs, organizations or events that promote our Native culture or art are given significant consideration for TKC contributions. Contributions may include supplies, food, and in-kind staff support for the event. Efforts will be focused both in the Middle Kuskokwim Region and in the Anchorage area. In areas where TKC has no staff, local partnerships will be pursued to benefit TKC Shareholders in those areas.

Other Donations

TKC is willing to consider other donations for programs and organizations beyond the three priorities that benefit our Shareholders.

Contribution Guidelines

1. Contribution requests made on behalf of 501(c) nonprofit organizations, Tribes or Villages will receive higher consideration.
2. Acknowledgement of any monetary donation is required. For IRS purposes, any donation will require an acknowledgement letter from the organization. The acknowledgement should be printed on organization letterhead, stating the amount and date of funds received. A sample letter will be provided.
3. TKC will have at least 30 days to process contribution requests.
4. All contributions are at the discretion of TKC.

Community Contribution Process

1. Applicants should complete a TKC Community Contribution request application. The application can be submitted via email, in person, fax or mail.
2. If approved, the contribution will be made to the entity making application.
3. TKC encourages event organizers to send project/event photos and stories for TKC newsletter and Annual Report purposes.
